Treasurers Report

Accounts for 2015: Starting 01/01/2015 Bank Balance: £5,370.97

Finishing 30/12/2015 Bank Balance: £5,647.82

Current Bank Balance: 28/02/2016 £5,340.75

We have made a profit of this year of £276.85 mainly down to the fact that we haven't had any unexpected bills or needed to make any large purchases. We have also made some savings on our insurance policies. Not to forget fund raising.

Our Insurance Renewals for the year so far: Boat Insurance = £231.11 payment made on 23/01/2016 compared to £224.26 last year & Public Liability Insurance = £503.00 payment made on 03/07/2015 compared to £791.32 the year before making a saving of £281.47.

The Bar takings banked for 2015 stand at £552.00 banked in December 2015 but some of that might have been carried over from the year before! I'm sure Mick's report will cover this in more detail.

With the loss of 3-9s sharing the pool and the pool fee's going up the pool is now costing us £39.15 per week! I think this item is on the agenda to be disgust in more detail.

The club has had a late submission penalty of £100.00 from HMRC's for not submitting a Corporation Tax Return for 2014 as requested! I have appealed against this on the ground that we didn't receive a request and that the late submission notification even arrived via BSAC's head office when they have my full details on file! I have copies of the letter of appeal and Tax Return on file if requested. The Tax Return has now been filed and pending.

The Club still needs as much fundraising as ever so could we all try to take a leaf out of Brian's book. He's raised the figure of £1,087.60 in 2015 compared to £669.00 the year before and still going this year. "Well done Brian".

BSAC have not increased their Membership Fee's this year so I think we should leave our Club Fee's set at £100.00 for diving members but possibly put the small increase on our associate and honorary members fee again as agreed at last year's AGM.

The club is looking into the possibility of upgrading the filtration on the club compressor, with a view to us getting a blending panel and O2. I am of the view that we should as a club be able to offer everything from air to trimix.

- Promotion of the club was also discussed and it was stated that posters were available and had already been put up in some public locations. Bill Hudson volunteered to arrange to have one put up at Billingham Forum.
- Having the AGM at the current time of year on a Sunday was discussed, with this year's being on Easter Sunday and last years was on Mothering Sunday. Both resulted in very poor turnout by the membership etc. It was proposed that starting in 2017 the AGM should be held on a Thursday night where more members will likely be able to attend. It was agreed therefore that starting in 2017 the AGM will be held on the last Thursday in March, time to be agreed.
- The current pool arrangements and sharing with other clubs, both us sharing and may us moving to another location was discussed. Discussions with another local club had already taken place and the costs savings to us due to the favourable rate we get then the savings would be negligible. There were the benefits of this other local club give us a closer location, but the pool is on 2m deep. The conclusion arrived at by those present was that we should continue to remain at Billingham Forum, but look at share with another diving club. Ally Hunt volunteered to approach Billingham Forum and find out which other dive clubs used their facilities.
- It was stated by a member that other clubs get subsidised for training new prospective members and that we should investigate this further.
- The new Rota for proposed diving throughout the year was discussed and explained by Paul Nesbitt, in the hope that we can get more diving in 2016.
